86 Mass. Ave. | Boston, MA

The 86 Mass Ave. branch was the first branch located in Boston for the Bank. Based on the standard finishes developed in the first "small bank" prototype in Malden, the Boston location needed to be more sensitive to the retail customers in the neighborhood.

Originally a convenience store, the space went through an extensive demolition process that spanned nearly 3-months. Once complete, the goal was to give the branch a high-end retail feel. Indirectly lit soffits, LED lighting, solid surface material, stainless steel, glass and hardwood floors were all incorporated into the design in order to enhance the image of the Bank along busy Massachusetts and Commonwealth Avenues. Existing brick walls, long since buried with previous renovations were restored and incorporated into the final design.

24-Hour ATM's were also incorporated into the design. Along with the ATM's an After Hours Depository gives the Bank's customers the ultimate in convenience and safety. The ATM lobby is visible from both Mass. Ave and Commonwealth Avenue through large expanses of glass making the banking experience more transparent.
