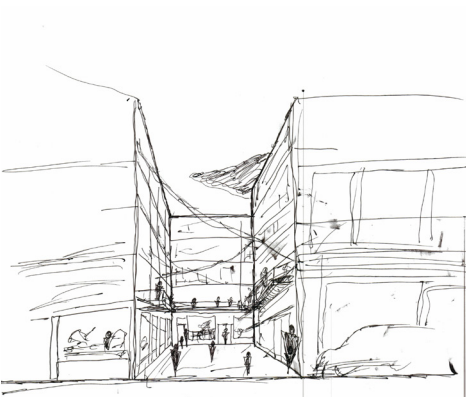

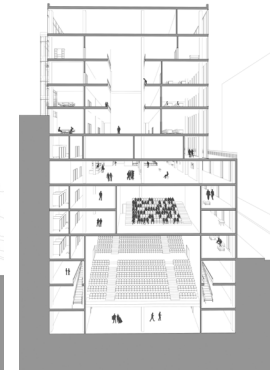
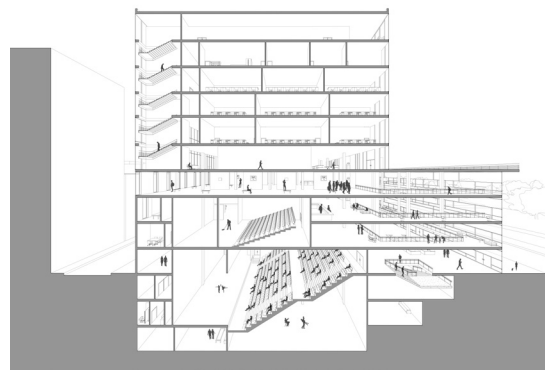
- Designed Expansion of Atlanta Contemporary Art Museum using existing building structure.

URBAN UNION NYC Community Center • New York City, NY • Spring 2018

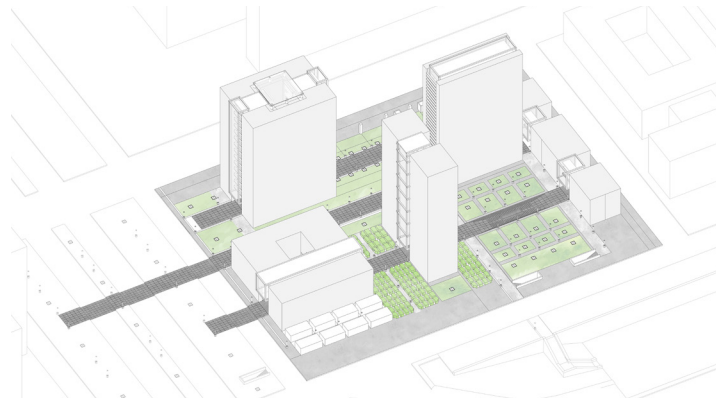
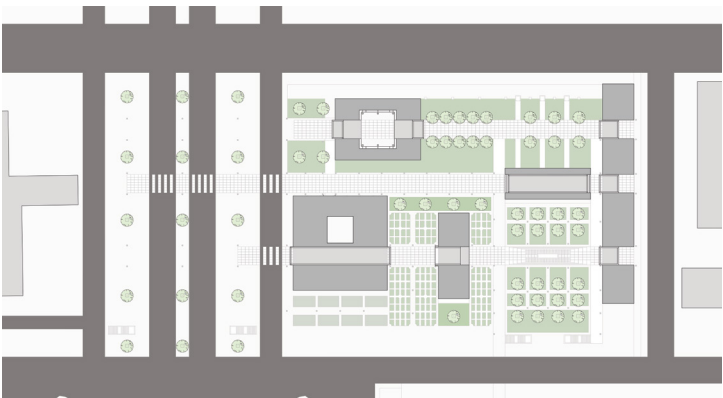


- Created new NYU student union, incorporating two theatres, meeting space, and common areas.

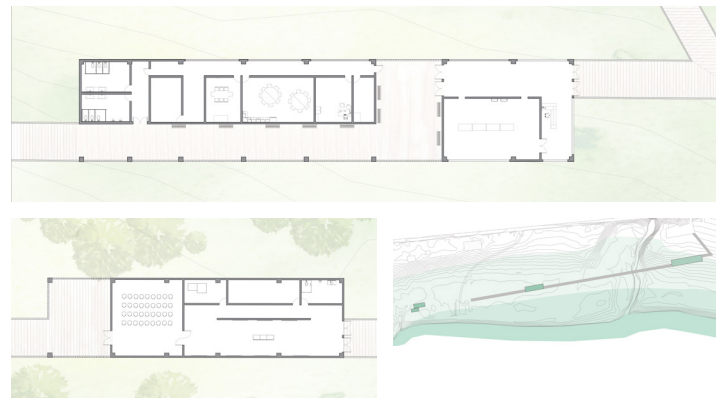

FORUM MODERNO EUR Business Center Redesign • Rome, Italy • Fall 2016



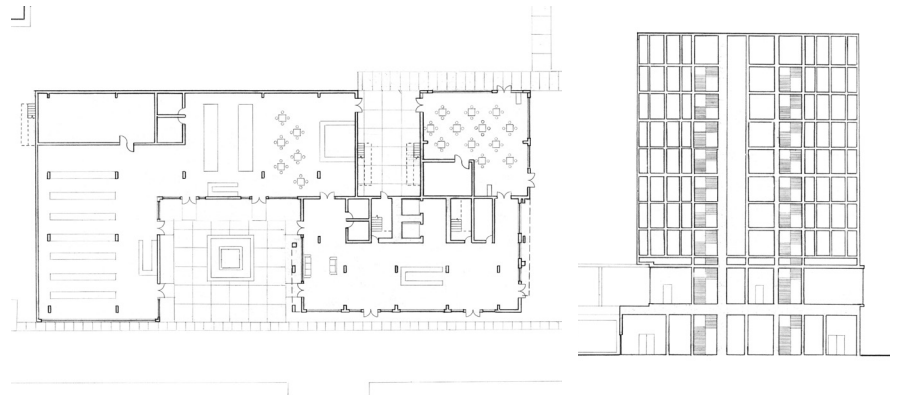
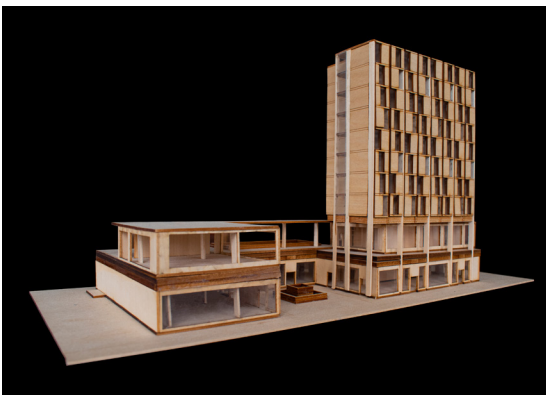
- Developed landscape design for five-building lot based on “modern forum” concept.
