
















The Point Apartments is a multi-family building located near the Chesapeake Bay in Cambridge, Maryland. The four-story building offers many features that respond to the imminent sea-level rise. These include resilient green stairs at the edge of the Bay that are designed to capture additional water and create a protected space that is usable for the residents. The mix of apartment units accommodates varied household sizes and are supported by amenities such as an atrium that leads directly to the resilient grass stairs, a community garden, private courtyard for residents, a café, indoor skate park, and basketball court. The building features places for all age groups to enjoy. The design of the project enhances the formal physical qualities of Cambridge and references the existing architectural styles throughout the community.

The Bridge connects the two buildings that comprise the College of Engineering and Architecture on the Howard University campus. The guiding principles for the project are centered on creating a space that fosters community innovation and inspiration amongst the members of the college. Inspiration is expressed through biophilic features that increase the environmental quality throughout the building. Innovation features encourages creativity, excellence and productivity within new community spaces for current students and prospective students and their families. The project includes more public gallery spaces to showcase student and faculty work, an art store, a café, large presentation spaces, auditoriums, and less public state-of-the-art classrooms and supporting facilities such as plotting rooms. Private work rooms, computer labs, and lounges for students, faculty and staff provide the space to exchange ideas and promote innovation and collaboration. A roof garden allows users to step outside into nature and to view the surrounding urban fabric of the city.




SENSORY ROOM confidential arena project

Thesis/Fifth Year | Spring 2022










Conference Floor Plan




