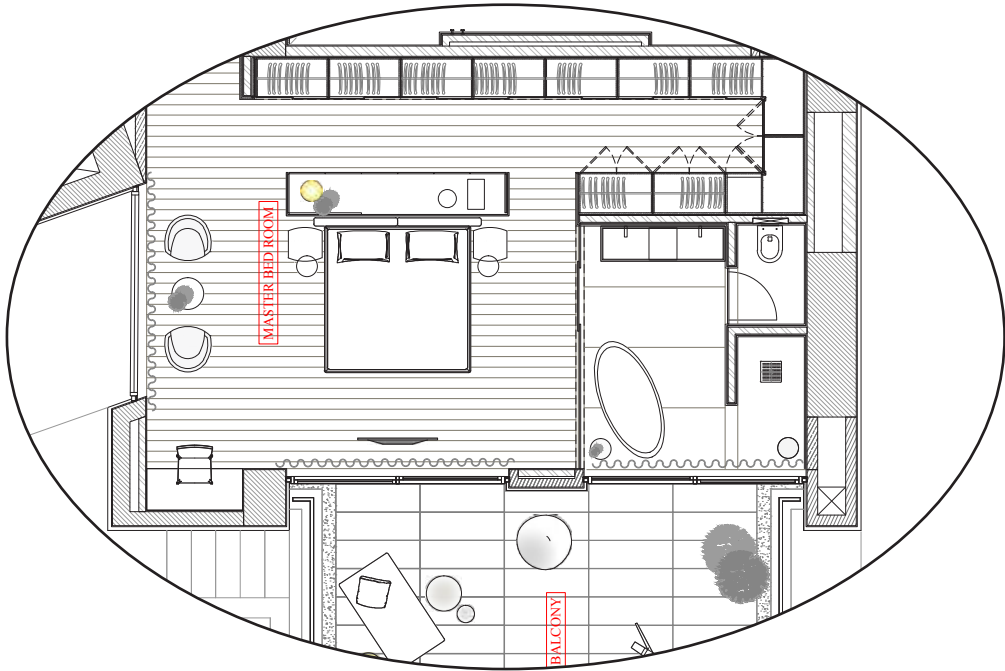
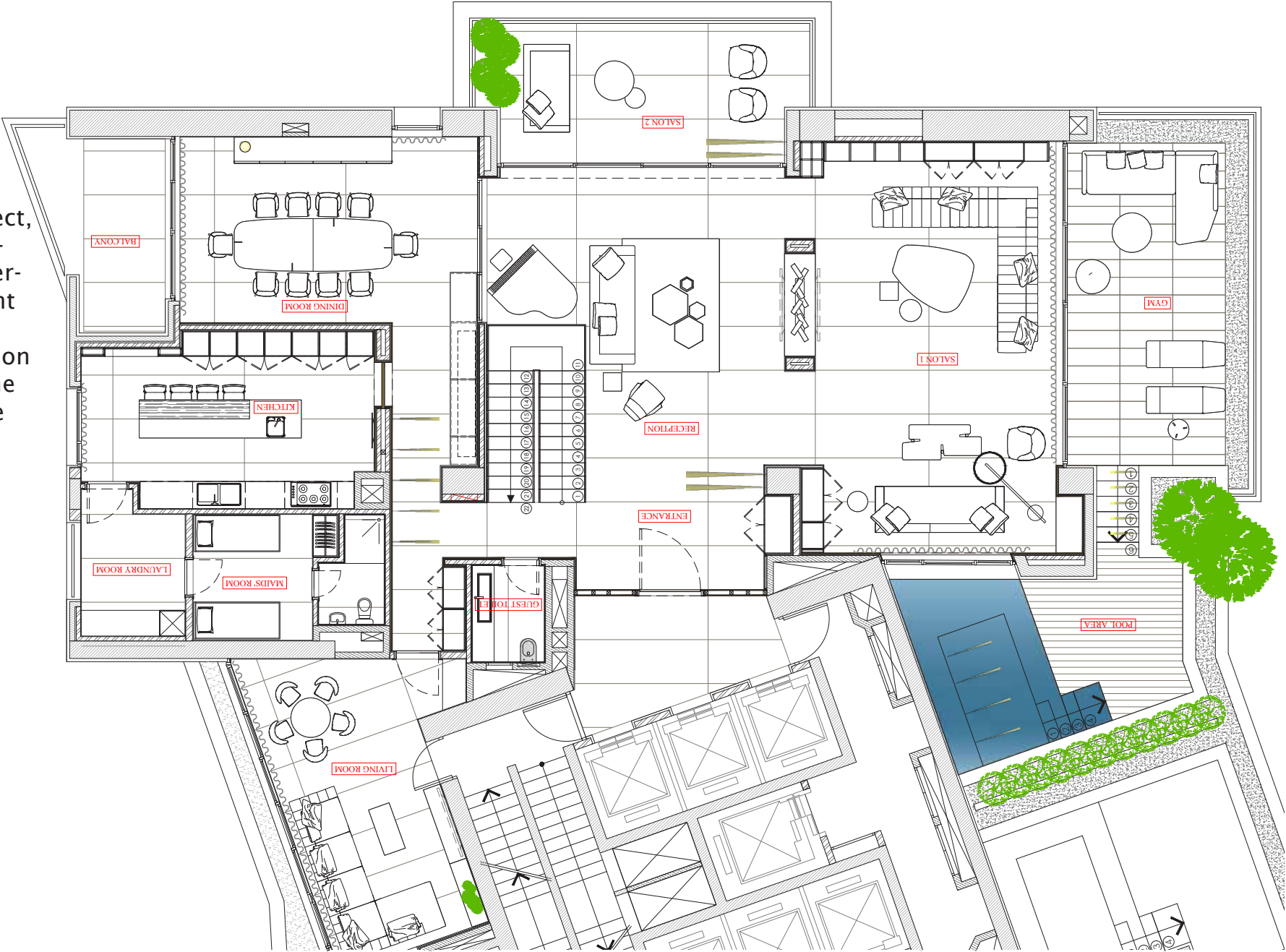

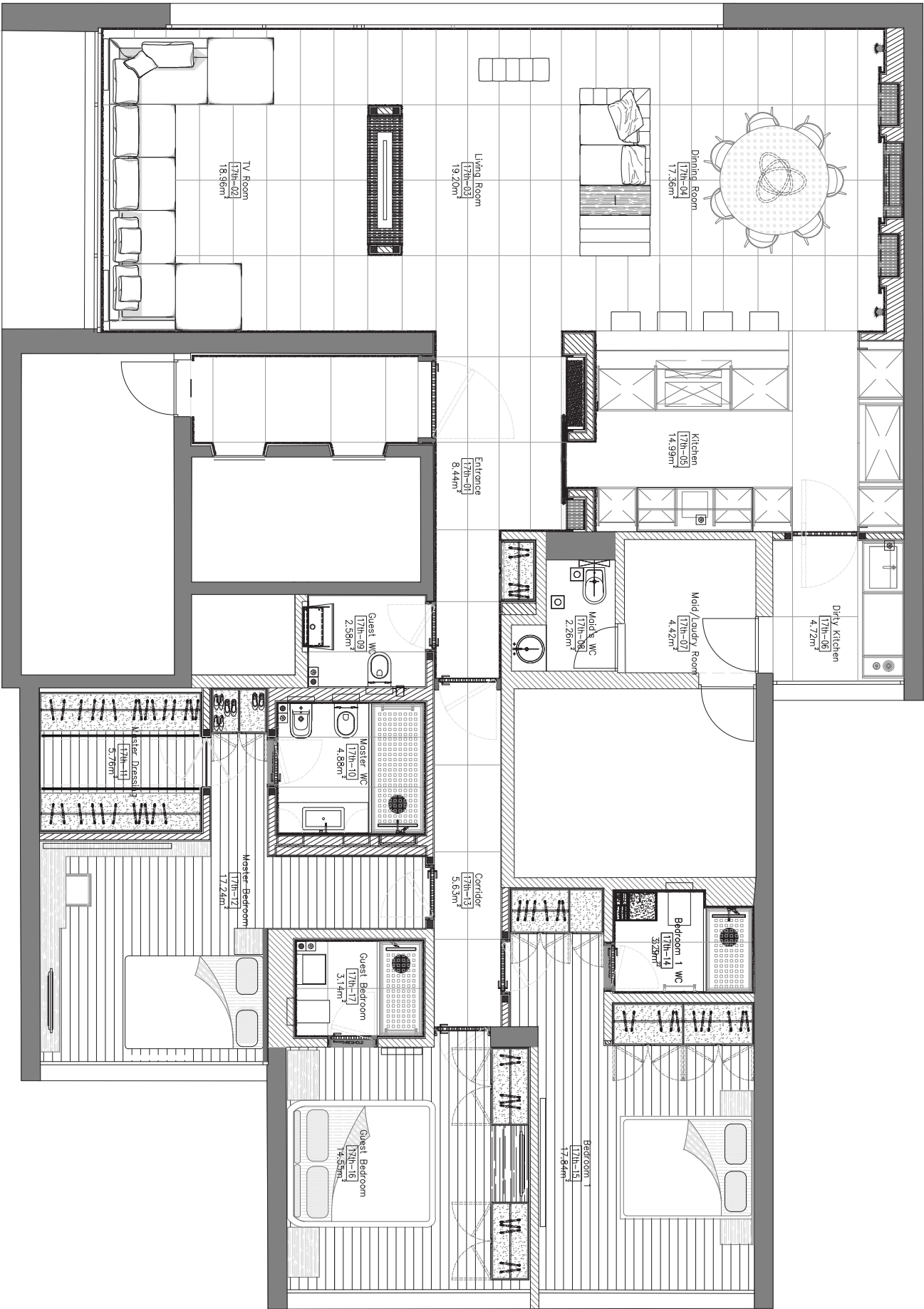

Our challenge was to establish a cohesive and inviting ambiance within a vast, uninterrupted space. The grand living area was further accentuated by double-height windows that spanned from floor to ceiling, allowing for an abundance of natural light. The strategic placement of light fixtures and the careful selection of varying light intensities were crucial in achieving our desired outcome. The end result is a warm and intimate atmosphere that does not compromise the significance of the space.

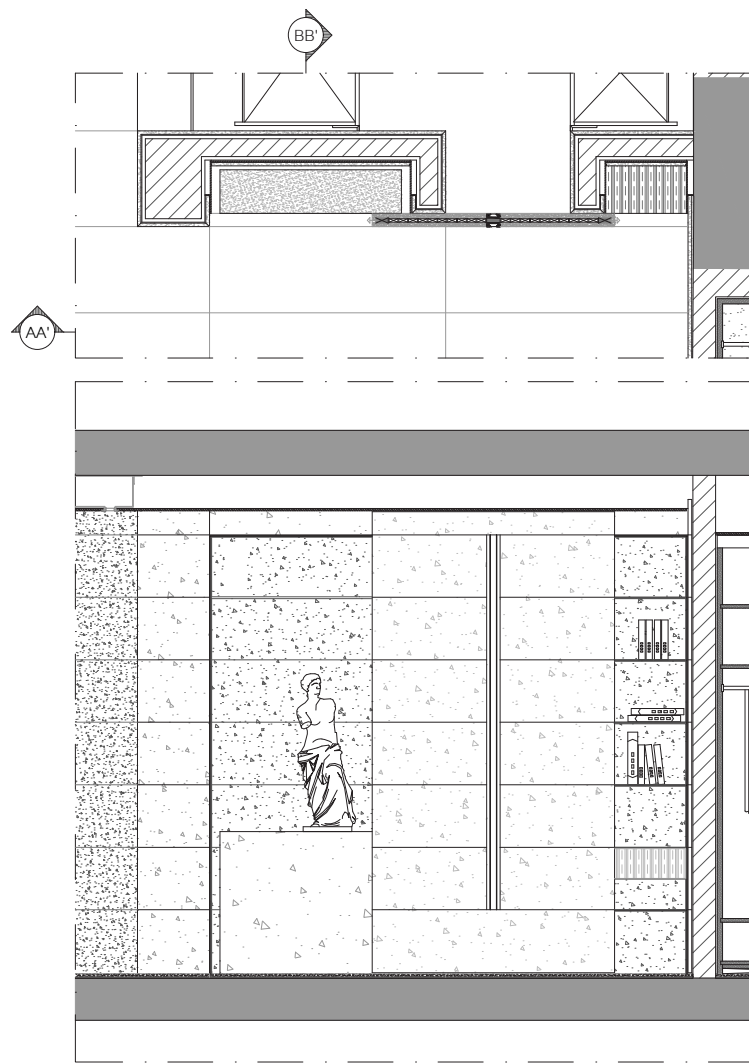


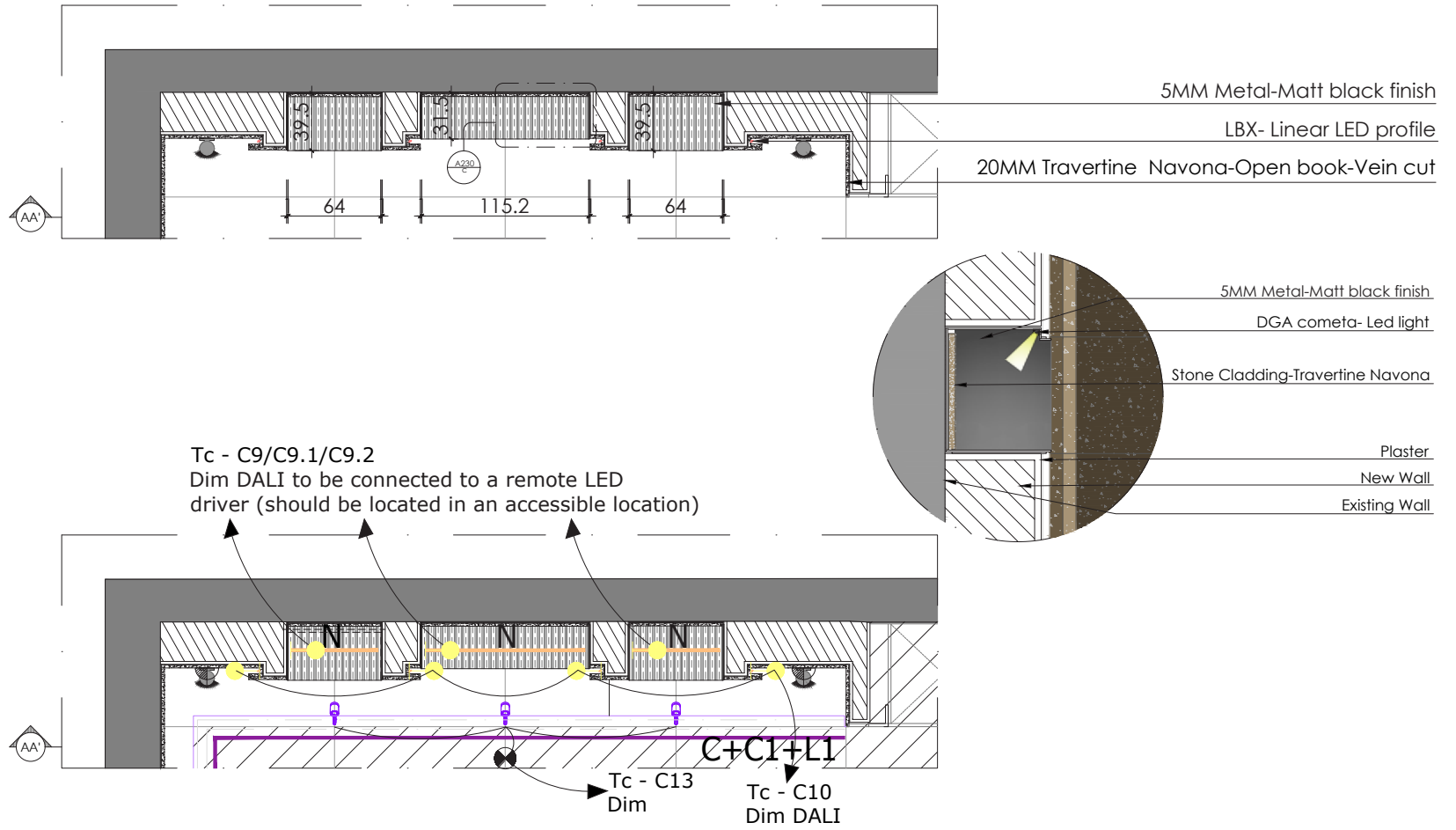
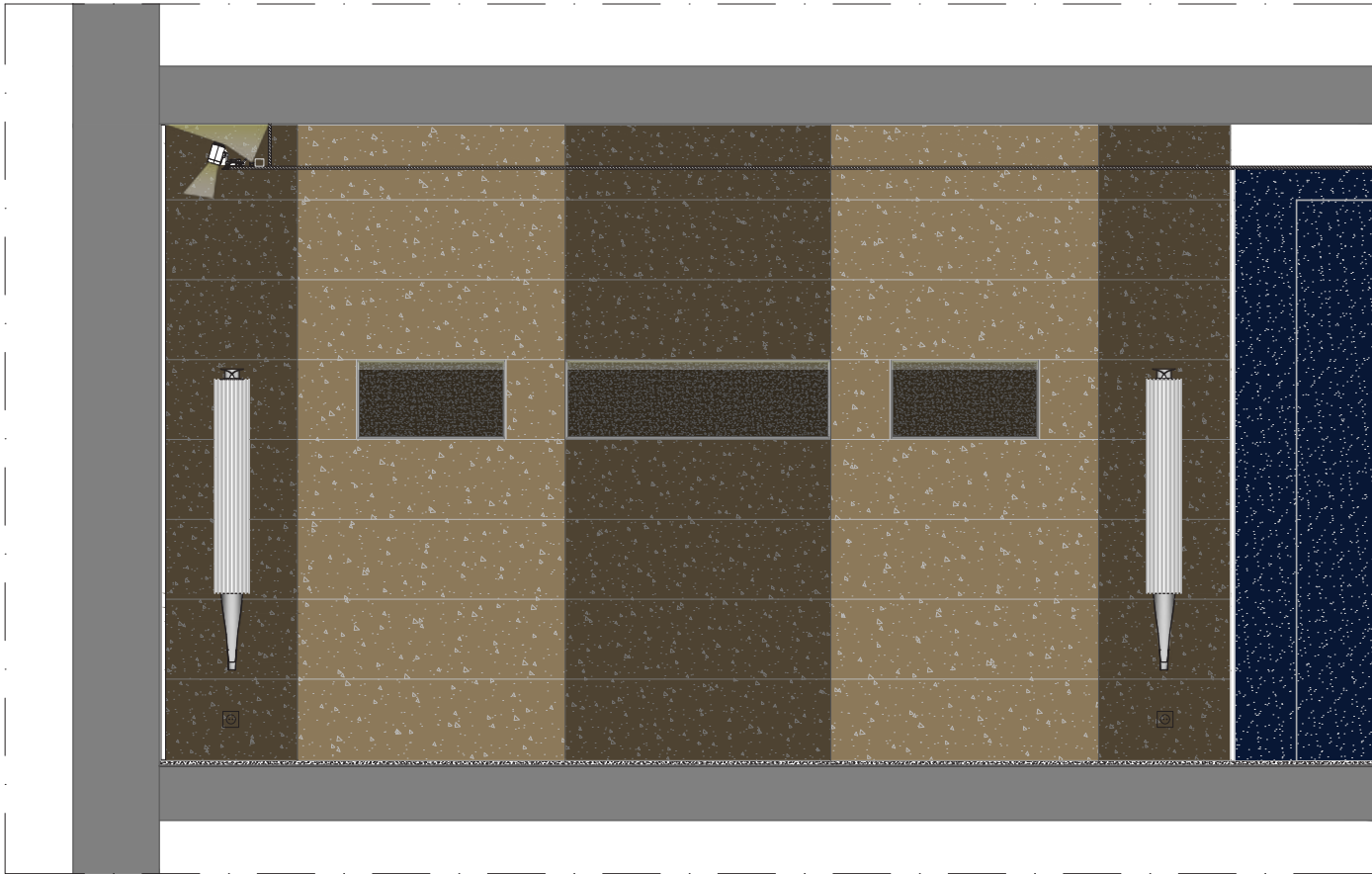

The primary objective of this project was to completely transform a residential living space into a showcase of comfort and sophistication. The residence underwent a thorough renovation, with all existing elements stripped down to the bare structure. Extensive reconfigurations were made to the floor plan, as well as the electrical and plumbing systems. To achieve a sense of cool harmony, the living room walls were adorned with open book navona travertine cladding, while the floors were adorned with cross cut navona travertine. This consistent use of materials helped to eliminate any visual thresholds and create an illusion of expanded space. The inclusion of a custom-made kitchen, a black metal fireplace, and beige travertine further enhanced the overall aesthetic by creating an exciting juxtaposition of light and dark, resulting in a dramatic and contrasting atmosphere. The end result is a cohesive and complementary living space within an apartment that exudes timeless luxury. (It is noteworthy that this is only a fraction of the entire project)

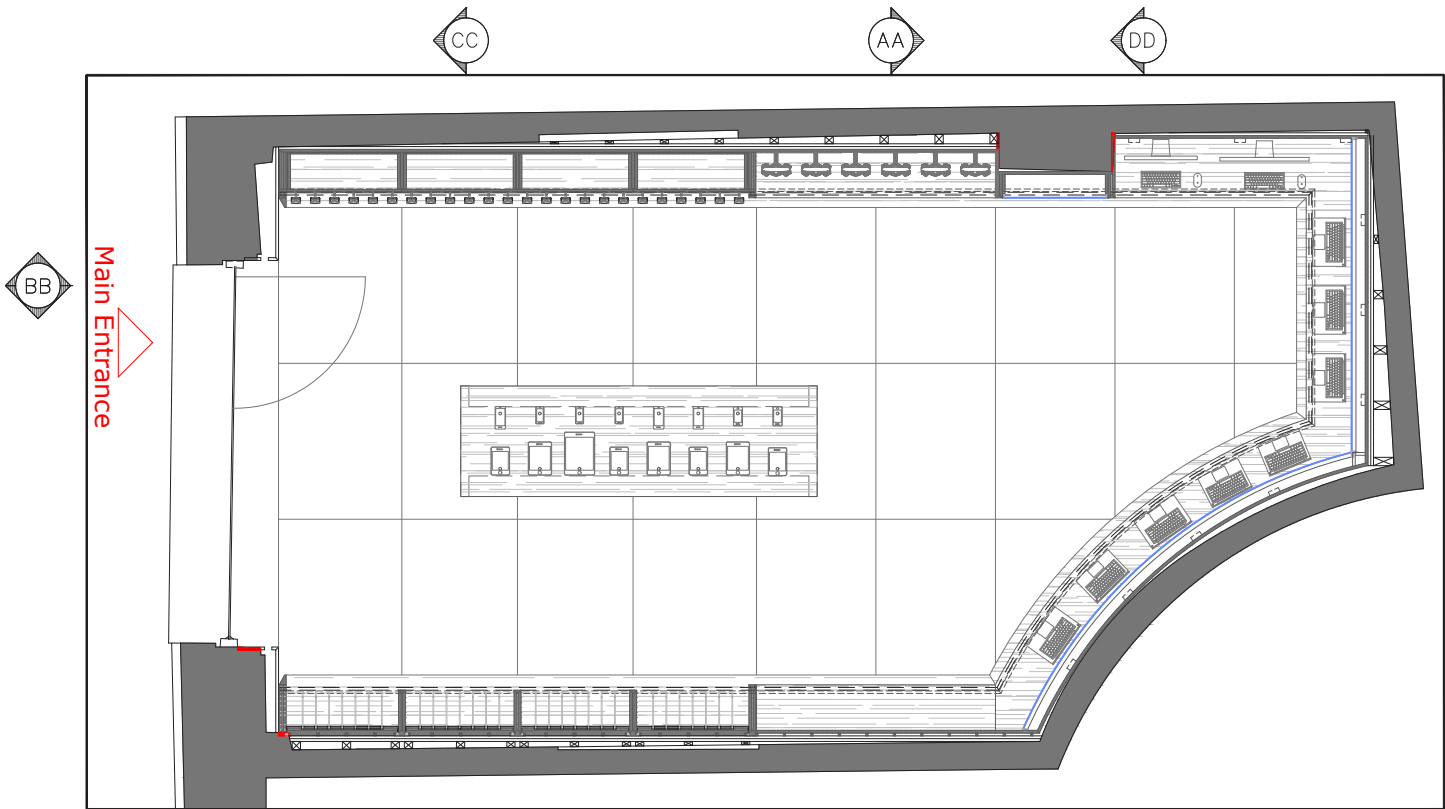

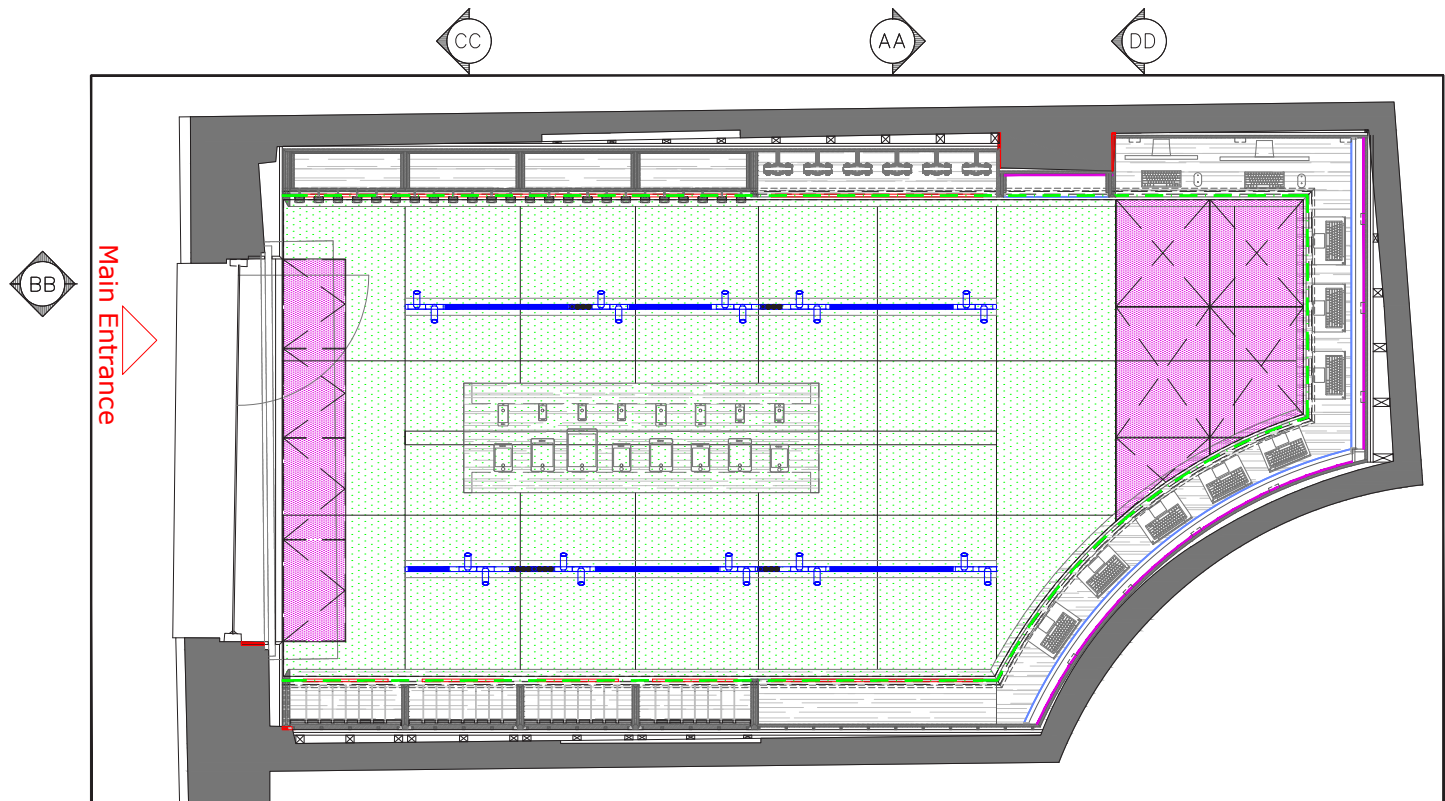

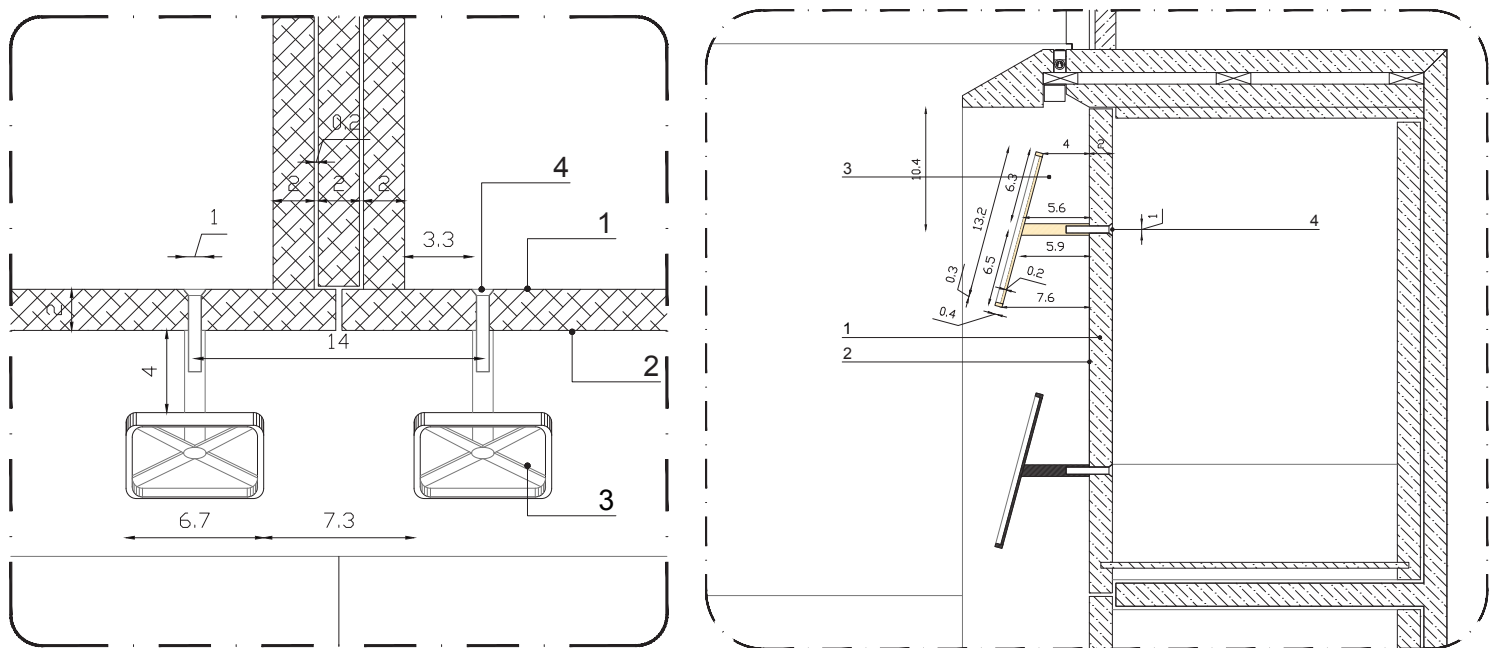

Bellow: reflected ceiling layout plan (including lighting and service openings)





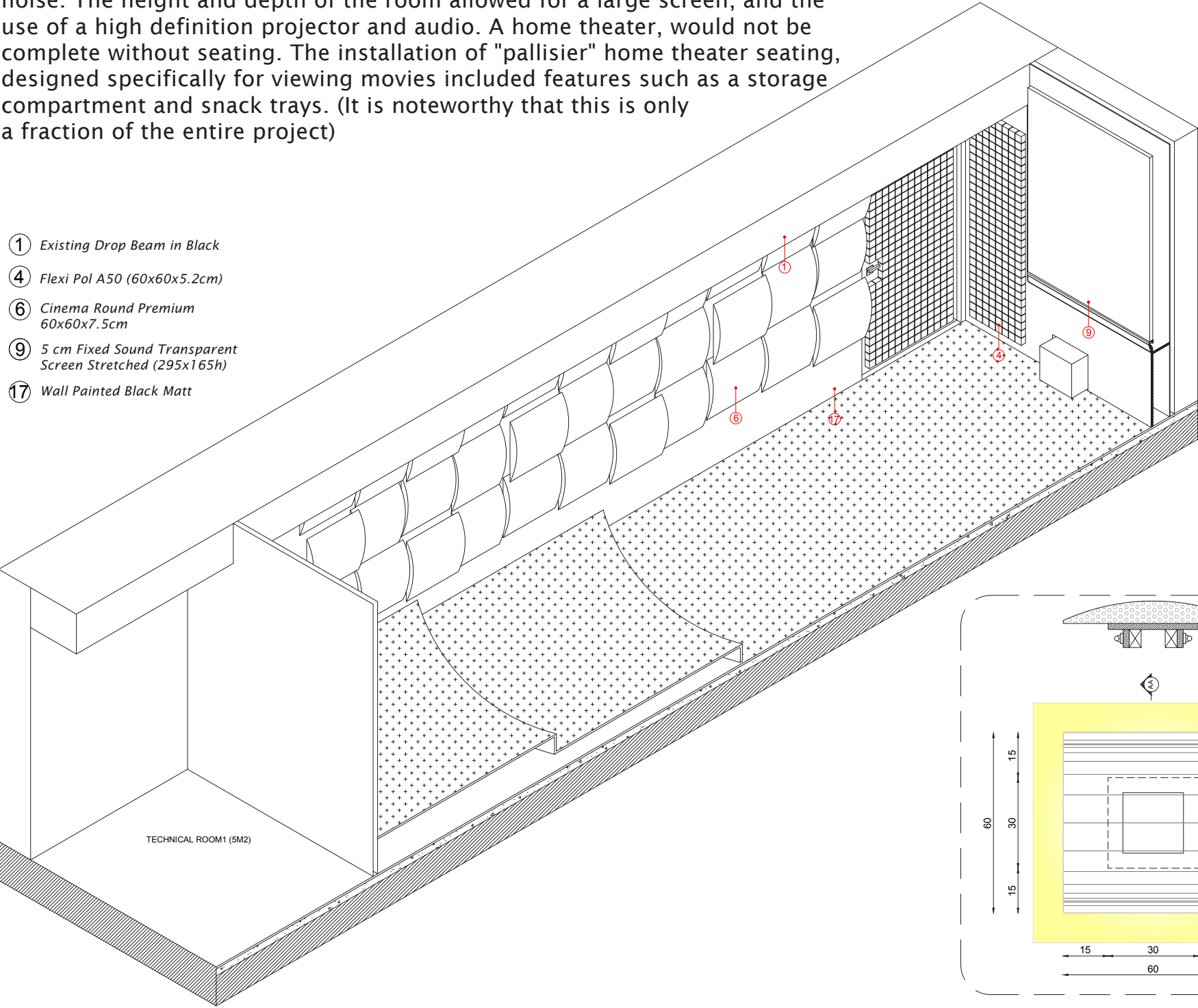

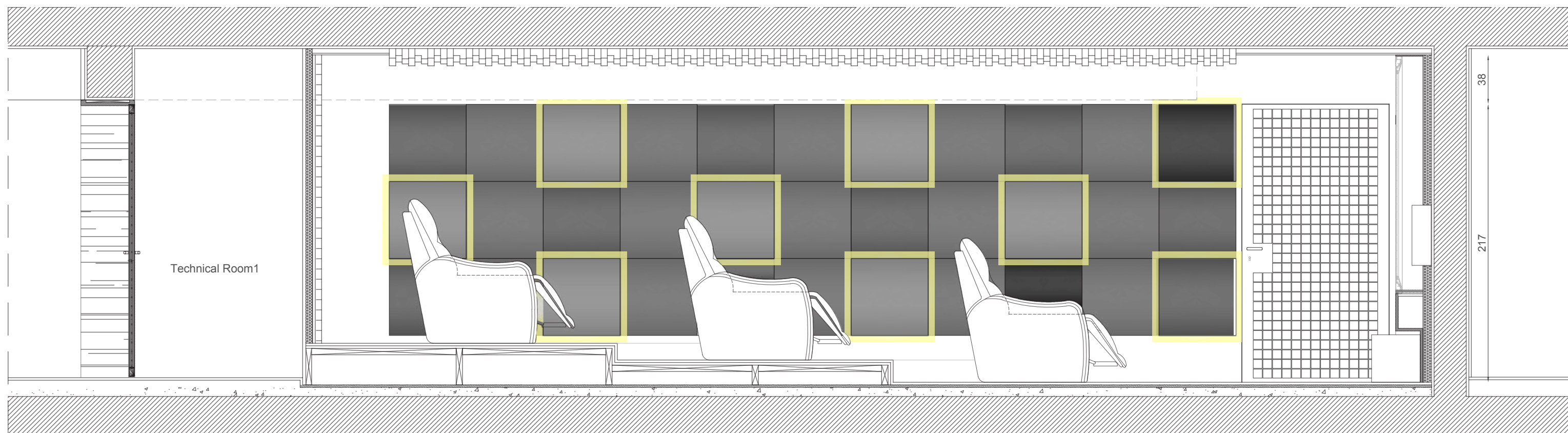
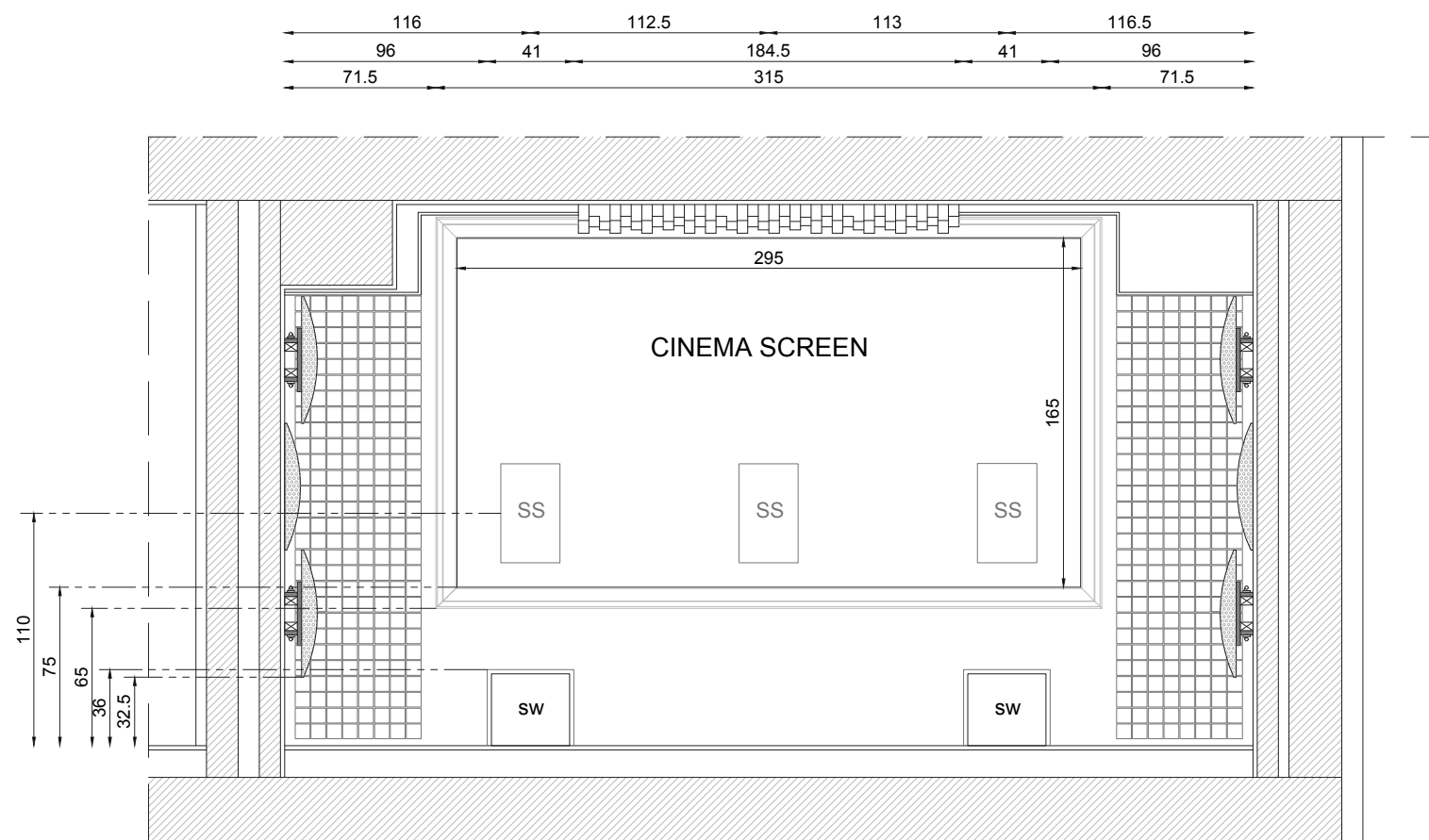
This project required dedicating a room in a private residence and bringing the cinematic experience to the client's home. The home theater layout and design needed advanced installation. A "room-in-a-room" construction was undertaken to isolate sound and improve the listening environment. To accomplish these specifications acoustic wall panels were put to block out noise. The height and depth of the room allowed for a large screen, and the use of a high definition projector and audio. A home theater, would not be complete without seating. The installation of "pallisier" home theater seating, designed specifically for viewing movies included features such as a storage compartment and snack trays. This elegant sculptural staircase discreetly occupies the foyer of a private residence, exuding a sense of sophistication. The utilization of marble for the stairs, banister, and wall imparts a substantial presence to this architectural feature. Embracing a graceful curved design, the stairs gracefully follow the contour of the banister, ascending towards the upper floor. The bullnose steps seamlessly merge with the overall composition, while the generous tread width enhances its visual allure. The decorative perforations adorning the marble banister infuse a sense of lightness to an otherwise imposing element. (It is noteworthy that this is only a fraction of the entire project)
