




FLOOR PLAN BARLOWE RESIDENCE





Inspired by Charlie's favorite Swedish cocktail bar, the loft's concept, "Mixology of Design," blends diverse design elements like crafting the perfect drink.


DESIGN INTENT


ABOUT









REFLECTED CEILING PLAN


- The afternoon sun hits the overhang, allowing in light but shading from direct glare
- The overhangs allow for light and heat in the winter when the sun in lower in the sky
- The glass floor brings views and lets sunlight to reflect in from the river
- Sliding curtain glass walls allow for natural views, ventilation, and light from three sides of the studio
- Solar panels allow the studio to remain off-grid
- LED Lighting is used for all fixtures, and only used to supplement daylight

FF&E, MATERIALS ANALYSIS

EXTERIOR

- White concrete will make up the key structural elements, including the floors, ceiling, and structural walls.
- 2. Glass curtain walls wrap around the studio, giving full forest
- The exterior wall in the bathroom is blue mirrored acrylic, letting in light while creating privacy.
- Blue acrylic will continue as accents on the exterior as thin strips wrapping around the roof line, middle line, and floor line.






INTERIOR

- White concrete will make up the key structural elements, including the floors, ceiling, and structural walls.
- Glass curtain walls wrap around the studio, giving full forest views.
- Blue acrylic makes up the railing dividing the workspace and lounge.
- A triangular glass floor at the end of the studio gives amazing views of the cliff and river, as well as reflective light.
- 5. Natural light wood will adorn the workspaces and kitchen/bar.








ABOUT





About









